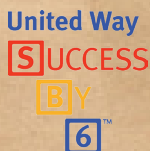

# Our Impact



## IMPROVING HEALTH

- 7,101 safe bed nights for children & adults
- 2,160 individuals received medical assistance
- 500 child forensic interviews were conducted
- 670 children & adults with physical or mental limitations participated in healthy activities



## PROVIDING FOOD, SHELTER, & STABILITY

- 280 domestic violence victims found safe shelter & strategies for safe & healthy lifestyles
- 23,000 meals were delivered to homebound residents
- 775,000 pounds of food were distributed to food insecure residents
- 2,789 families were linked to basic needs resources & 1,328 individuals were assisted with emergency needs



## FOSTERING LEARNING

- 365 children participated in year-long mentoring activities
- 125 special needs children received targeted care to help them realize their greatest potential
- 35,611 age-appropriate books were delivered to children throughout our community
