Our Impact

IMPROVING HEALTH

- 72 homeless individuals were provided a safe area to quarantine during COVID-19
- 1,990 individuals received medical assistance
- 450 child forensic interviews were conducted
- 659 children & adults with physical or mental limitations participated in healthy activities

PROVIDING FOOD, SHELTER, & STABILITY

- 107 domestic violence victims found housing free from their abuser
- 74,610 meals were delivered to homebound residents
- 775,000 pounds of food were distributed to food insecure residents
- 2,100 families were linked to basic needs resources & assisted with emergency needs

FOSTERING LEARNING

- 601 children participated in year-long mentoring activities
- 1,105 students were connected to resources to keep them motivated and engaged in learning
- 52 special needs children received targeted care to help them realize their greatest potential
- 38,423 age-appropriate books were delivered to children throughout our community
