
# WorkFORCE

connections

WorkFORCE Connections (WFC) is a collaborative program designed to provide education opportunities and work-readiness skills in tandem with other career preparation services. WFC empowers atrisk youth in Calhoun & Cleburne counties to gain long-term employment success, while supplying a skilled workforce for local in-demand industry sectors.

21 students have successfully graduated WFC and entered into employment or post-secondary education, with 30 currently enrolled for the 2022-2023 school year.

HopeUNITED, United Way of East Central Alabama's Anti-Trafficking Initiative, exists to partner, collaborate, and provide services to help stop and prevent sex trafficking in our local communities and beyond. Our work includes prevention efforts through awareness, education, and training, as well as intervention efforts through connections with local and statewide resources and organizations. We are focused on providing safe communities and a lifetime of stability and well-being for all residents. United we fight. United we win. United we can stop trafficking!

ANTI-TRAFFICKING INITIATIVE













VITA exists to assist low to moderate-income households file their taxes and maximize their hard-earned dollars. This free service ensures that residents receive all of their tax credits, get ALL of their refund, and encourages them to use their refunds wisely.



In the 2022 filing season, VITA provided free tax assistance to a total of 1,392 households were assisted across the county resulting in \$1,751,082 in total refunds.



Dialing 2-1-1 connects you to a trained operator 24/7 that has access to a comprehensive database with a multitude of services in our community. 2-1-1 is designed to assist families from all walks of life, but most importantly benefits our most vulnerable populations such as the elderly, people with disabilities, and low-income by facilitating access to public and community-based services. You can text for help too! Text your zip code to 898-211 and message one of our live 2-1-1 specialists for help.

In October 2022, United Way of East Central Alabama established a local 2-1-1 Call Center specifically serving Calhoun, Cleburne, and Randolph Counties. Since that time, UWECA's 2-1-1 Call Center has answered 2,356 local calls, with 1,930 connections to assistance made for housing, rental assistance, utility assistance, food, clothing, and other essential needs.

United Way of East Central Alabama serves as the Community Champion of Dolly Parton's Imagination Library for children & families in Calhoun, Cleburne & Randolph Counties. This means UWECA is fiscally responsible (approximately \$30 per child enrolled annually) for sustaining the program. The initiative provides an age-appropriate book each month to children from birth to five years of age. The program is free to the family and the child and is open to children ages birth to 5 years living in Calhoun, Cleburne or Randolph County.

There are 3,359 total children enrolled throughout Calhoun County.





## Helping **Families Initiative**











The Helping Families Initiative (HFI) is a partnership with the District Attorney's Office of Calhoun & Cleburne Counties and Calhoun County Schools to provide a supportive approach to solving chronic absenteeism, provide wrap-around services for students & their families, and provide crisis intervention & case management. Ultimately, our goal is to improve student success, graduation rates, and family stability, all while reducing dropout rates, substance abuse issues, and juvenile arrests.

In the 2021-2022 school year, 2100 connections were made with students & families for help with absenteeism, with 700 connections being made to wrap-around services including food, clothing, transportation needs, school supplies, and mental health services.

In 2019, the only emergency shelter in Calhoun County closed-exacerbating our community's homelessness crisis. In fact, from 2022 to 2023, the number of chronically homeless men and women rose from 68 to 111. In 2021, the Anniston City Council recognized the need for coordinated care for those experiencing homelessness and created the Community Task Force on Homelessness, led by United Way of East Central Alabama, to create solutions for this community-wide challenge. The collaborative work of the Task Force identified three community partners with integral components to the answer: United Way of East Central Alabama, The City of Anniston, and Anniston First United Methodist Church. These essential partners created Martha's Hope: The Martha Vandervoort Center to End Homelessness and The Holloway House for Transitional Living.








